(Information received by Affiant concerning Offense)

became violently angry when discussing Ken Franks, and had argued with Ken Franks on various occasions. Willie Tompkins states that the accused had mentioned after July 13, 1982, that he had seen the two girls who had been killed in the same episode as deceased Kevin in his store on July 13 and that he was glad Ken Franks was killed. ~~at~~ <sup>at</sup> The accused had, prior to July 13, 1982, threatened in the presence of Lisa Cader to "put Ken Franks in the hospital." Gail Kelly states that on one occasion the accused found Ken Franks in her apartment ~~and before~~ <sup>before</sup> July 13, 1982, and displayed a violent outburst of temper. She also relates that he stated to her after July 13 that Ken Franks "got what he deserved." On September 12, 1982, in the presence of Gail Kelly and Patty Deis, the accused, while discussing the death of Ken Franks and the two girls, stated twice "I killed them." On Sept 13, 1982, the accused told Gail Kelly that he was "transferring his business" and leaving the state on Sept 14, or tomorrow, and told her "don't doublecross me." Gail Kelly states the accused is known as "Lucky."

That because the source of information mentioned in the preceding paragraph is reliable and because this information has been corroborated from other sources by Affiant he has just reason to believe and does believe that the accused did commit the aforesaid offense.
